Destination Brahman Week

The Brahman industry's flagship sale, Rockhampton Brahman Week Sale, saw more than \$7 million exchange hands between vendors and buyers over the three days.

The sale – the penultimate multivendor sale for the industry's leading red and grey Brahman genetics – largely followed the trend currently being experienced across the industry, with easing market conditions at play.

Total revenue was \$7,887,000, with an overall average of \$10,216. Of the 837 bulls offered, 772 were sold for a 92 per cent clearance rate.

Action on each of the three days was even, with 252 lots going under the hammer on day one (\$2.38m), following by 246 on day two (\$2.44m) and 238 on day three (\$2.9m).

While the 2023 results fell short of the record-breaking highs of 2022 including the average \$16,722 and total revenue of \$13,121,000, demand was still high.

Easing market conditions gave some commercial beef producers an opportunity to purchase elite Brahman seedstock that may have been previously out of reach.

The \$120,000 Tarramba True North 4664 (IVF) (PP) with vendors Adam, Tracy and Wallace Gunthorpe, Tarramba Stud, Banana and buyer Brian Harriman, Reedybrook B Stud, East Palmerston and Anthony Ball, Elders Stud Stock.

The 47th RBWS attracted more than the 360 registered bidders, mostly from Queensland, the Northern Territory and NSW, and 181 buyers used the Elite Livestock Auctions online platform to place bids.

Top Performers

The top priced bull and top selling red sire was the Tarramba True North 4664 (IVF) (PP), offered by Gunthorpe Cattle Company and purchased by Reedybrook B Brahmans, East Palmerston, for \$120,000.

Sired by Y3K Billionaire 9002 (PP) and dam Tarramba Dienka 4168 (ET) (PP), the two-year-old polled sire came with an "unflappable nature".

Mountain Springs Nashville (ET) (PS), a 26-month-old red polled sire, found a new home with the Rockemer Family, Gigoomgan Pastoral, Brooweena, paying \$100,000.

Offered by Monto breeders, Eugene and Jessica Mollenhagen, Nashville was sired by Fairy Springs Duracell 3606 (PS) and dam Mountain Springs Carolina (ET) (PP). The second top selling bull was noted for his "great sirey head, good bone, excellent length, tidy underline with an exceptional temperament".

A 33-month-old polled grey bull, Doonside 2794 (IVF) (PS) was the top selling grey bull and equal third highest selling bull, fetching \$90,000.

Presented by Bill and Kay Geddes, Milman, Rockhampton, the impressive bull was sired by MR V8 279/7 (IM US) (PS), and dam Rockstar Martin Impress 68 (IVF) HH). He was purchased by the Eulogie Cattle Company.

Kandoona Red Brahmans' first of two top ten performers, Kandoona Kennedy, 17056 (PP), sold for \$90,000.

The 23-month-old horned red bull, sired by Somerview Rockefella 2719 (PP), and dam Kandoona 14972 (PS), found a new

home for \$90,000, courtesy of Ewedale Grazing Partnership.

A 25-month-old, polled red sire, Rockley Arkyn (ET) (PS), was the fourth highest selling bull, going under the hammer for \$80,000.

Offered by long-time seedstock producers, Rockley Brahmans, Arkyn was sired by Elmo Picasso 1023/7 (PP), and dam Rockley Miss Datababe 125 (IVF) (PS), and purchased by Joseph and Felicity Streeter, Fairy Springs Brahmans.

Eureka Creek Brahmans presented the fifth top selling bull, Eureka Creek Marindi (PP), a 25-month-old grey polled bull, sired by Avee 977 (PP), and dam Eureka Creek Zara 576 (PS). Marindi was purchased by Kenilworth Brahmans, Mount Coolon, for \$70,000.

The red catalogue of 368 bulls returned \$4,006,500 to an average \$10,887,

Some 403 grey bulls exchanged hands to return \$3,881,500 for an average \$9,632.

Vendors large drafts

Some 22 studs presented drafts of 10 or more sires.

Kelly Creek Pastoral Company, Wandilla, Marlborough, team of 20 bulls sold to average \$10,250 to a high of \$29,000 for Wandilla O'Reilly 724/0 (H).

Reade Radel, Kandoona Red Brahman, sold a draft of 20 bulls, returning an average \$19,775, for a high of \$90,000 for Kandoona Kennedy 17056 (PP).

Next was Hazleton Brahmans, Blackwood, Middlemount, who sold 19 sires to

average \$9,315 and a high of \$20,000 achieved twice for Hazleton Mascot 6301 (H) and Hazleton Ezra 6172 (H).

Wowan seedstock producers, Fenech Brahmans, Craigleigh, achieved an average \$6,777 for their draft of 18 bulls, to a high of \$25,000 for FBC Benji Manso 670/2 (H).

NA and H Sorley, Mt Callan, Dalby, sold 18 bulls, to an average of \$14,444, twice reaching highs of \$40,000 for Mt Callan Westwood 50/22 (PS) and Mt Callan Werribee 20/22 (AI) (PP).

A team of 16 sires from Fern Hills Grazing Trust, Fern Hills, Bajool, returned an average \$9,675, to a high of \$57,000 for Fern Hills Zodiac 4074 (PS).

Rockley Brahmans, Rockhampton, sold 16 bulls to an average \$16,312 and a high of \$80,000 for Rockley Arkyn (ET) (PS).

Tony and Kathy Mortimer's draft of 14 bulls returned an average \$6,285 to a top of \$22,000 for Token Noah 1019/1 (AI) (PS).

S and V Hayes, Mundubbera, 14 bulls, \$196,000, av \$14,000 and a high of \$24,000 for Yenda V 842 (IVF) (PS) and Yenda V 835 (PS).

Of the catalogue, there were some 444 polled/scurred bulls, averaging \$11,481 and return \$5.09m. The remaining 322 bulls were horned, averaging \$8,564 to return \$2.75 million.

Largest RBWS draft heads across the border

Northern Territory commercial beef producer, Rallen Australia, assembled a draft of 49 Brahman bulls to lead the group of bulk purchasers at the Rockhampton Brahman Week Sale in October.

Owners of several large pastoral properties in northern Australia, Rallen Australian paid an average of \$4,796 for their draft, to a top of \$7,000 for Tarramaba Talladega 4459 (PP).

Riverside Pastoral Company, Nebo, took home 33 bulls for an average of \$18,712, to a top of \$15,000 for Kandoon Richford 17039 (PP).

Charters Towers brothers, Garry and Trevor Core, SP Grazing, trucked home a draft of 28 red bulls to their properties, Spring Park and Mt Fullstop, for an average \$11,107. The brothers top purchase was Rockley Harold (IVF) (PP) for \$28,000.

Mt Isa-based Lawnhill Riversleigh Pastoral Holding P/L purchased 21 bulls to an average of \$4,000.

GKW Pastoral Holdings, Injune, paid an average \$8,111 for a draft of 18 bulls to a top of \$22,000 for Lot 881 for Halgenaes Shiraz (IVF) (PS). Peter and Del Marie Glenwright's Laroona Pastoral Company, Charters Towers, took home a draft of 17 bulls for an average of \$6,471, with their top sire Yenda V 845 (H) which they paid \$12,000.

Red sire tops RBWS sale for Tarramba

Topping the red catalogue and earning bragging rights as the top selling bull for RBWS 2023 was Tarramba True North 4644 (IVF) (PP).

The Gunthorpe Cattle Company's 23-month-old sire, out of Y3K Billionaire 9002 (PP) and dam Tarramba Dienka 4168 (ET) (PP), was noted for his "unflappable nature".

Reedybrook B Brahmans purchased the quality sire for a sales high of \$120,000.

The red catalogue – with some 368 bulls going under the hammer to return \$4.06 million to an average \$10.887 - left the best to last with the

top three sires going under hammer on day three.

The second top selling red sire and second highest bull of the sale was Mountain Springs Nashville (ET) (PS).

Going under the hammer for \$100,000, sired by Fairy Springs Duracell 3606 (PS) and dam Mountain Springs Carolina (ET) (PP), the 26-month-old was purchased by Gigoomgan Pastoral, from vendor EE and JM Mollehagen and Sons, Langley.

Reade Radel's Kandoona Kennedy 17056 (PP) was the third highest red sire, fetching \$90,000.

The 23-month-old horned bull, by Somerview Rockefella 2719 (PP) and Kandoona 14972 (PS) was purchased by Ewedale Grazing Partnership, Biloela.

Rockley Brahmans's Rockley Arkyn (ET) (PS) changed hands for \$80,000. Fairy Springs Brahmans purchased the fourth highest selling red Brahman.

Noted for "possessing breed character, silky skin, strong carcase qualities all in a structurally correct package", Arkyn was sired by Elmo Picasso 1023/7 (PP) and dam Rockley Miss Datababe 125 (IVF) (PS).

Samari Grazing Company walked away with the fifth highest selling red sire, paying \$57,000 for Fern Hills Zodiac 4074 (PS), from the stable of Fern Hills Grazing Trust, Bajool.

The 25-month-old red polled Brahman, noted as a "growthy sire, length and perfect temperament" is the son Muan Venture 6230 (PS) and Fern Hills Miss 2724 (H) (APX D)

A 33-month-old bull topped the grey Brahman catalogue at Rockhampton Brahman Week Sale, going under the hammer for \$90.000.

Doonside 2794 (IVF) (PS), from Bill and Kay Geddes, Doonside, Rockhampton, found a new home at Eulogie Cattle Company. The son of Mr V8 279/7 (IMP) US) (PS) and Rockstar Martin Impress 68 (IVF) (H) went under the hammer on the second day of sale proceedings.

The bull trumped Eureka Creek Marindi (PP) who had announced his arrival in good form, fetching \$70,000 for vendor, Eureka Creek Brahmans, Monto, early on day one.

The 25-month-old sire from Avee 977 (PP) and dam Eureka Creek Zara 576 (PS), was noted for having "beef and bone with good feet and legs" and had already made an impact on his home herd.

Marindi found a new home at Kenilworth Brahmans.

The equal third highest grey Brahman sire was also sold on day one.

Brahrock N Bradford 182 (IVF) (H), sired by Lancefield S Talladega 5282/1 (PS) and dam Brahrock Massai Power 6093 (IVF) (H), earned vendors Neville and Shannon Sommerfeld, Brahrock, Maryborough, \$65,000.

Ivan Price's Moongool stud prefix shared in the third highest sire and also claimed the fourth top priced grey Brahman bull on day two.
