Jumbuck's largest Brahman holdings include Kilarney Station (541,000 hectares) and 40,000 Brahman cattle which it purchased in 2014 and Wave Hill Station located 500 kilometres south of Katherine adding a further 1.25 million hectares of land and around 40,000 head of cattle.
